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## Unmetered Tri-Partite Agreement (UTA)

Guidance Document v1.0

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## Introduction



- A framework-style Unmetered Tri-Partite Agreement (UTA) was introduced by Electricity North West in response to stakeholder requests.
- The UTA is an agreement between the ICP, the unmetered asset owner/adopter and Electricity
  North West for the delivery of unmetered street connections only. All other connections require
  a Bilateral Adoption Agreement (BAA).
- The ICP must enter into a Master Adoption Agreement (MAA) with ENWL prior to commencement of any works.

## The Unmetered Tri-Partite Agreement (UTA)



- The mandatory fields to be completed for each agreement are highlighted.
  - Name, company number and registered address of the ICP
  - Name and address of the Local Authority for adoption of street assets or name, company number and registered address of the asset owner
  - Name of the geographical area where the assets will be delivered
  - Date the UTA is to commence from
  - Signatures, name and position of the ICP and Authority
- The UTA must be completed and returned to our contracts team <u>contracts@enwl.co.uk</u> for ENWL sign-off at least 5 days prior to work commencing.
- ENWL will then sign and return the UTA for your records.
- The Tri-partite agreement is valid for a period of two years.
